After a hard-fought campaign, the United Conservative Party (UCP) came out ahead in yesterday's election albeit by a narrower margin than in 2019. In last night's speeches, both leaders spoke about hopes for the incoming government to represent all Albertans over the next four years. ASEC looks forward to working with members of both parties to ensure access to affordable and high-quality post-secondary education is a priority for all at the legislature.

In the 2023 budget, many of ASEC's long-time advocacy priorities were satisfied, including:

- Implementing a 2% cap on tuition increases for the 2024-2025 academic year onward
- Reducing Alberta Student Loan interest to prime
- Extending the repayment grace period to 12 months from 6 months for Alberta Student Loans.

ASEC hopes these commitments will be implemented as planned and will continue to advocate for policies to best support post-secondary students in Alberta.

ASEC represents more than 110,000 college, polytechnic, and university students from 17 members across Alberta.
